Additionally, proper identification through visible ID badges and uniforms helps patients quickly identify staff roles in emergency situations. Healthcare environments also contain vulnerable patients who may have respiratory sensitivities to perfumes or allergic reactions to certain materials, requiring stricter controls than typical office environments.

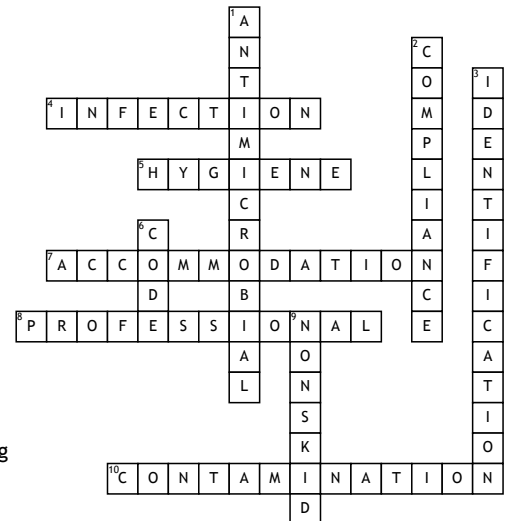
