Key Components of IT Systems

Hardware

- Physical devices: smartphones, tablets, Chromebooks, printers
- Different hardware serves different purposes

Software

- Programs/applications running on hardware
- Examples: Google Classroom, browsers, games, productivity tools
- Hardware is useless without software

Networks

- Systems connecting devices to share information
- Internet as world's largest network
- School networks enabling resource sharing

Data

- Information IT systems process and store
- Types: text, numbers, images, videos, sound
- How data becomes useful information

Real-World Applications

- Schools: tracking grades, online learning, research
- Hospitals: patient records, health monitoring
- Weather forecasting: prediction models, warning systems

Impact and Implications

- How IT changed learning, work, and communication
- Importance of IT skills for future success
