Common Pitfalls and How to Avoid Them

Another pitfall is confusing temporary situations with permanent personality traits. Just because you feel uncomfortable speaking in public now does not mean you cannot develop those skills if they are important for your career goals.

Do not make career decisions based solely on online personality tests. Career personality is one piece of the career planning puzzle, but you also need to consider practical factors like salary requirements and job market demand.

Quick Implementation Guide

Start exploring your career personality by paying attention to when you feel most energized during school projects and part-time jobs. Notice whether you prefer working alone or in groups, whether you like detailed tasks or big-picture planning. Take advantage of career personality assessments available through your school counseling office. Popular tools include the Myers-Briggs Type Indicator, the Holland Interest Inventory, and StrengthsFinder assessments.

Seek out informational interviews with professionals in careers that interest you. Ask them about their personality traits and how those characteristics help them succeed in their work.

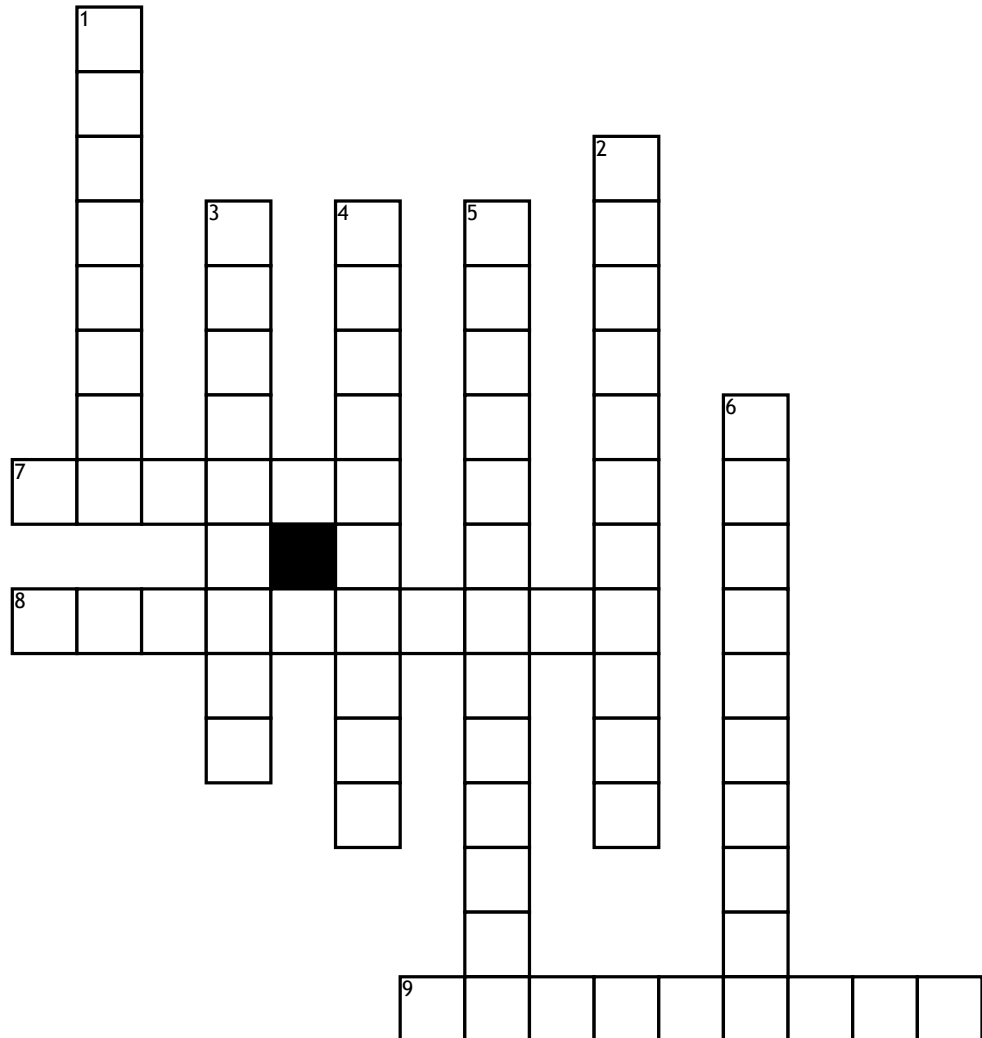
