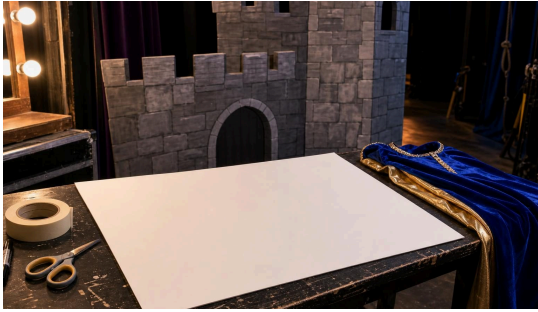




Play Poster Checklist

Miriam is smoothing air bubbles from the school play poster near the prop table. The drama teacher handed over a checklist left from yesterday's rehearsal. It says print posters, get approval, add ticket dates, then proofread names. That order is off, because approval should come after the dates and names are checked. The first batch would waste paper if Miriam follows the list exactly. She needs one clear sentence to point out the problem without redoing the whole plan.

Write the exact sentence Miriam should say.

Miriam needs to tell the drama teacher that the checklist order is wrong and name the better order.

- the checklist order is wrong
- add dates and proofread names before approval
- print after approval

Example: The checklist should have us add the ticket dates and proofread the names before getting approval, then print the posters.

Responses will vary. Accept any answer the student can give a practical reason for.

Think about it: What would go wrong first if the posters were printed before the dates and names were checked?

TEACHER NOTE

Responses will vary. A strong answer says the checklist order would waste paper and gives the corrected sequence: add dates, proofread names, get approval, then print. Accept any sentence that clearly tells the drama teacher the list should be changed before printing.

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
