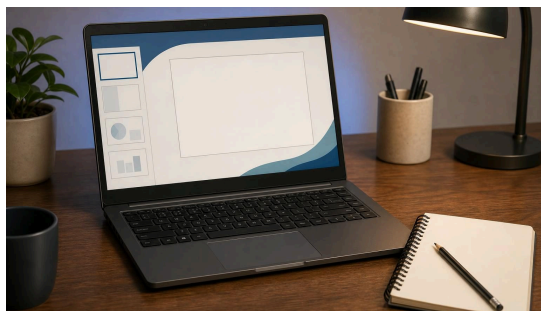




Missing Chart Slide

DECISION MAKING · WHICH WOULD YOU PICK

Ariel is reviewing the shared slide deck after her group marked the presentation nearly finished. One slide still shows a gray image placeholder where the chart should be. The speaker notes include a link to Tuesday's survey results, where the missing chart was supposed to come from. The group planned to submit the deck after checking links, captions, and order. Without the chart, the last slide makes a claim with no evidence. Ariel can either leave a clear note or check the survey results before adjusting the slide now.

Pick the better option and give one practical reason.

- ☐ Add a comment on the slide explaining that the survey chart is missing, then list the deck as unfinished.
- ☐ Open the linked Tuesday survey results, confirm the numbers, then replace the unsupported claim with a brief summary that cites the survey.

Give one reason this choice keeps the deck easier to finish.

Responses will vary. Accept any answer the student can give a practical reason for.

Think about it: What would change if Ariel submitted the deck with the image placeholder still there?

TEACHER NOTE

Responses will vary. A strong answer identifies how the option prevents a confusing or unsupported final deck. Accept either choice if the reason explains how Ariel can clearly carry over the missing chart or verify the survey evidence before using it.

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
