



Driver Log Message

COMMUNICATION · FIX THE MESSAGE

Hassan slides the laminated route cards back into the driver's-ed cabinet while the last group parks beside the practice cones. The instructor had asked him to send one closing message after checking the log sheet and returning the key pouch. Hassan found his night-driving observation line still blank, because he missed that slot during a school assembly. He sent a quick message that said it was back, and he still needed to make up the driving thing. The instructor can handle one make-up request today, but only if the message names the missing requirement and confirms the key pouch location. The cabinet will be locked after this driver's-ed slot, so another vague message could carry the problem into next week.

Rewrite Hassan's message so the instructor knows exactly what was returned and what still needs to be scheduled.

It is back, and I still need to make up the driving thing.

Missing: the exact item returned and where it was placed; the specific missing requirement that needs a make-up slot

Example: I returned the key pouch to the driver's-ed cabinet, and my log still needs the night-driving observation signed. Can the make-up slot cover that requirement?

Responses will vary. Accept any answer the student can give a practical reason for.

Think about it: What makes the revised message easier for the instructor to act on before the slot closes?

TEACHER NOTE

Responses will vary. A strong rewrite identifies the key pouch location and the exact missing requirement, then asks for a make-up slot clearly. Other acceptable answers may use different wording if the instructor can tell what was returned and what needs scheduling.
